

Our Spirit-led Journey to the Supernatural

- **Inspiration**

Must be inspired when “hearing” the Word. This causes hope to start to arise. You think, “This is for me?” and you start to experience the first inkling of *hope*. *Logos* in form, the letter of the law, or simply put - raw information; the planting and reception of the Seed (the Word... Mark 4) into our hearts.

- **Meditation**

From Joshua 1:8, we learn that as we meditate [think over and over a thought, speaking to ourselves the “possibility” of that thought from hearing the Word coming to pass in our life] we start to see that hope more clearly, more promising. We start to see (“observe” from Joshua 1:8) and we start preparing for that Word coming to pass in our life (“do” from Joshua 1:8). This is our faith giving substance to it (Heb. 11:1) and becomes our evidence above and beyond our physical senses to the contrary. From Matthew 12:33-37 and 2 Corinthians 4:18, we are changing the natural realm to that spiritual realm; we are overcoming the evil with the good (Romans 12:21). The root system of the Seed takes place here by watering (renewing) our mind to the Truthfulness of His Word over the natural circumstances. *Logos* is fading and *Rhema* is growing in its place; the promise is becoming clearer and surer. We become more focused on the promise rather than the circumstance. This ‘watering’ is our speaking the “hope” out our mouths. This is called confession **unto** faith.

- **Revelation**

The outcome of Meditation. The *Rhema* that the promise is ours has arrived. This is the place where Abraham was “fully persuaded” (Romans 4:17 – 22) and consequently, gave praise unto God for the promise (before he had it in the natural). The mountains of adversity are blown away, we know our path is without fail, the promise is sure. The Law of the Spirit of Life has superseded the Law of sin and death. We with patience (consistency) wait for the manifestation of the thing hoped for. This is called confession **of** faith – *Rhema* is speaking now.

- **Manifestation**

Now you have it in the natural. Hope is finished and is no longer needed (Romans 8:24, 25). By continued praise / thanksgiving, continues the reality of the promise and maintains the Life (activity) of that promise in our lives. We keep that particular promise alive by our continual attitude of praise. Jesus obtained the sureness of the promises... we maintain them active and alive in our lives by the voice of thanksgiving and our watchfulness over our thought life to the contrary (2 Corinthians 10:5 & 6).
